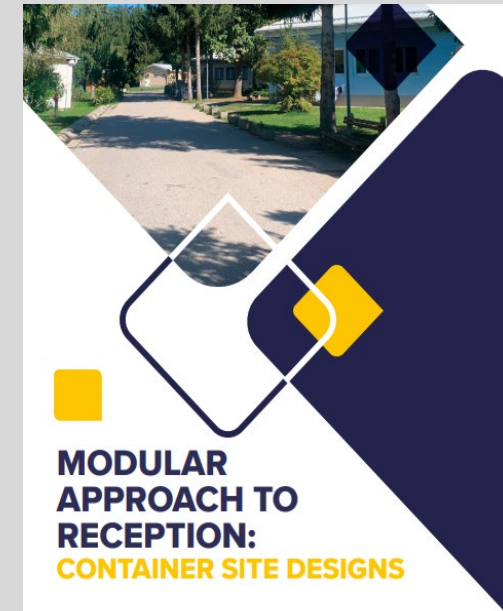
- ❑ *COI Specialist Network* to discuss COI needs following the war in Ukraine

Training on Temporary protection

INFORMATION MATERIALS

- ❑ Information leaflets on temporary protection are available on EUAA website. There are two versions, one for adults, the other for children.
- ❑ Information leaflet on access to the asylum procedure was developed and translations into Ukrainian and Russian and selected EU languages (BG, DE, EL, ES, FR, HU, IT, LT, LV, PL, RO, SK) is ongoing
- ❑ Leaflet: Screening of special needs and vulnerabilities for the purpose of TPD transfers within EU.
- ❑ Poster on self-identification of vulnerabilities and special needs for persons fleeing Ukraine

IF YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW IS:

- ... come to and arrived with parents, family members or other
- ... have been in a prolonged situation, might need additional help (people with special personal care, schooling, counselling, etc.)
- ... living with physical disabilities, impairments, or chronic medical conditions (including the difficulties arising from the emergency medical care they got)
- ... injured, wounded or being sick
- ... having unmet, serious, chronic illness, mental illness, or any past and/or present mental health condition
- ... being pregnant, unborn, recently or to be born (including the difficulties arising from the emergency medical care they got)
- ... or in any other situation requiring support

Reach out and ask for help.

Looking for the family, support for you or other persons, and other support services, including:

- Age and gender separation
- Medical care, including specialist treatment, medication, support equipment (crutches, etc.)
- Psychological care, including for mental wellbeing
- Schooling for children
- Support to file a report if you have been the victim of a crime
- Look for employment
- Legal help and advice
- Look out for clearly identified information (links provided by the authorities or the non-governmental and non-profit organisations. They will assist you in identifying the opportunities and support for your situation, as some private offers might put you at risk.

What you need to know about temporary protection

This information is for you if

- you are under the age of 18
- you are Ukrainian or lived in Ukraine, and left because of the war on or after 24 February 2022
- you arrived:
 - on your own
 - with someone other than your parents

Remember

- If you do not understand something, you can always ask.
- All information you share with...

What temporary protection means for you

- You can stay in the EU until it is safe to go back.
- You can get help to contact and reunite with your family, when safe for you.
- You can have food, clothes, a safe place to stay and other things you may need.
- You can go to school.
- You can go to the doctor.

If you are without your parents, an adult (sometimes called guardian or representative) will help you with your needs, including the procedure. You can always reach out to this person or other officials if you are scared or need help.

How long does temporary protection last?

Until 4 March 2023. Depending on the situation, it can be extended.

What is the procedure?

- An official will ask you questions about you and your family.
- You will be asked to show your identity documents (passport, ID card, etc.).
- You will receive an official document.

Are there any other forms of protection?

Yes. Discuss the options with the authorities with the support of an adult.

Inform the authorities if

- You came on your own or with someone other than your parents.
- You want to contact and find your family.
- You do not understand the language — someone who speaks your language can help.
- You feel unwell and you need a doctor or medicines.
- You are scared because someone is threatening you or trying to convince you to do something you do not want to do. You could be in danger.
- You know children who are in trouble.

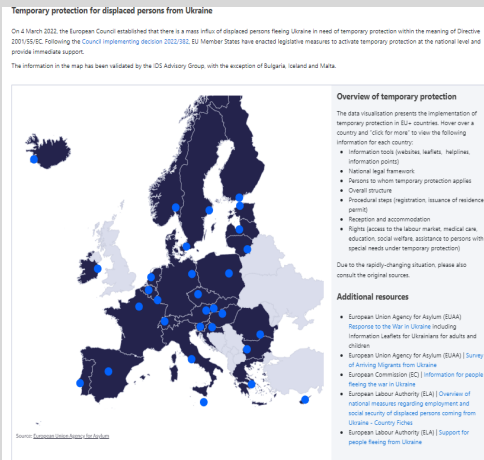
For your safety

- Never get into a car or vehicle with someone you do not know.
- Keep in contact with your family or friends.
- Keep your important documents safe (passport, ID card, etc.). Take photos of them.
- If you have a phone, do not give it to anyone.
- If you feel in danger or need help, call 112 at any time. It is free.
- Never talk online to someone you do not know. Do not share your personal information or photos of yourself.
- Ask for support if you feel in danger because of the way you dress, look or feel.

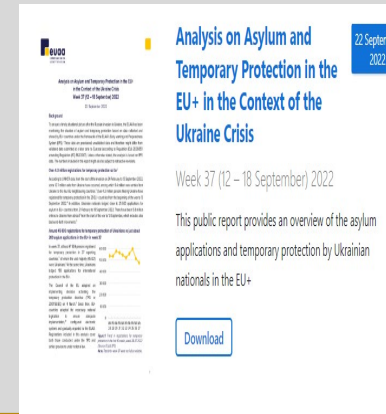
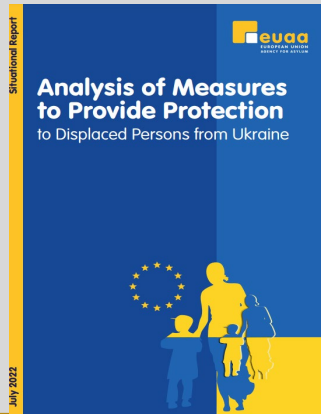

MAPPING TRENDS

- ❑ Situational Awareness on developments relating to immediate response and implementation of TP
- ❑ IDS Section analytical information on TP implementation (restricted)
- ❑ Daily data on TP and weekly reception data (Ns of people leaving Ukraine and fleeing to EU+ countries and Ns of hosted in EU+ reception systems)
- ❑ Weekly analysis on asylum applications, TP and reception data (limited)
- ❑ The EUAA Survey of Arriving Migrants from Ukraine (SAM-UKR) is a rapid data collection initiative to gather information on displaced populations from Ukraine and address information needs at the global level.
