

## Post-communist Democratization as DeBordering

### Communist Bordering

#### Hyper Bordering

 Cold war borders – fortified, militarized

**State** – the monopoly of agency of borders & e/i/migration

 Borders - symbol of sovereignty of a closed society Over-production of borders vs.
Under-production of migration

## Shift of Agency vs. Redefinition of Bordering vs Sovereignty

### Historic & Symbolic Fall of Berlin wall

• From closed to open society

  - parties, civic & uncilvil actors, artists








### Detained Third-Country Nationals (Jan–Apr 2024 vs. 2025)




