Reference across files

(almost) systematic reference to 'third country nationals and/or stateless persons' across the files

Definition (APR, AMMR, screening)

- Of stateless persons
- harmonized
- in line with international law

Recitals (APR, AMMR, EUROD AC)

- acknowledge the competence of MS
- stress that MS should respect their international obligations towards stateless persons
- recall the Union's pledge that all Member States on accession to Statelessness Conventions

Screening

- Vulnerability check
- Art. 12
- with a view to identifying whether a third-country national might be a stateless person, vulnerable or a victim of torture or other inhuman or degrading treatment, or have special needs within the meaning of Directive 2008/115/EC, Article 25 of Directive (EU) 2024/1346 and Article 20 of Regulation (EU)

2024/1348

Improving identification

Screening

- the health and vulnerability check will include the identification of whether a thirdcountry national might be a stateless person
- the screening form will include the field indication of 'nationalities or statelessness'
- if so MS are obliged to provide timely and adequate support

APR

- where an individual claims not to have a nationality, that fact shall be clearly registered pending the determination of whether the individual is stateless
- 'nationalities or, if applicable, an indication of statelessness' will be indicated in documents issued to confirm an asylum application

Objective

Identification = key step to strengthen the protection of stateless persons, thus allowing them to enjoy core fundamental rights and reducing the risk of discrimination or unequal treatment (in recitals of the AMMR and APR)
